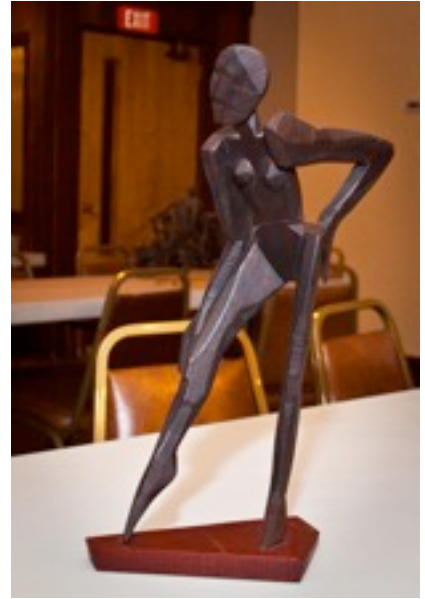
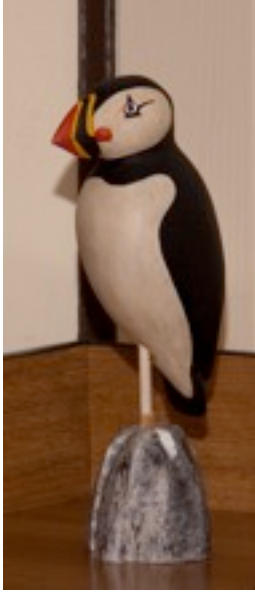
Bob Guge Workshop (3 Openings Call Carl)
