February Timed Carving Contest

Since this is the first time we have had a contest like this, the original idea put forth in the December newsletter has evolved to make it easier for you to carve in your own style and hopefully have more fun while participating. Instead of being handed a pattern and a cutout, you will now be handed a block of basswood measuring 1.5" x 1.5" x 6". You will have 1.5 hours to carve anything you like. You don't have to use the entire piece of wood and you can use any tools that you bring along with you. At the end of the 1.5 hours, you will put down your tools and the judging will begin. Prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd will be awarded.

There are lots of reasons to give the contest a try - You'll be among friends, you'll receive a free block of wood, you will be challenging yourself as you try something new. You may even win a prize! If those reasons don't move you, you are always welcome to come and watch the fun.

Carvers' Qigong

Instructor: Steve Gilbert

Qigong is a mash-up of Tai Chi, Yoga, acupressure, and gentle stretching. It was created 3-4,000 years ago in China and is practiced in thousands of schools throughout the world.

The Carver's Qigong Sessions will be focused on reducing the tension and pain, that commonly results from a long session of carving, knitting, crafting, computing, etc.

The sessions will last about 10 minutes, each session being different than any other. They will be held a few minutes prior to the start of all other classes, so that you won't miss any carving classes. They will be held outside if weather permits, or in the downstairs lobby or library.

Genesee Country Village and Museum has invited GVWC members to carve during their Maple Syrup weekend, March 29 & 30, 10am - 3pm each day. Like the October event, there will be no charge for club members who participate, but family and friends will be charged regular admission. Lunch (or brunch in this case!) will be on your own.

From GCV&M: "In some ways the weekend is very similar to our fall event - it's focused on nature and the outdoors. Our Nature Center and pancake breakfast are the stars, and we have the

opportunity to highlight activities in the Historic Village that we aren't able to do at other times of the year. We work with members of the Haudenosaunee community to share indigenous stories, offer timber sports demos with FLCC students, host an entire trail of maple interpretation, and more. The event is rain or shine. We only cancel the event if roads are closed or an emergency is declared. We monitor the weather very closely, so the call is never last-minute. I was thinking GVWC would do well in our Town Hall (which has a modern heater) in the center of activities in the Historic Village."
