New Chips Off the Block

RWS Lecture and Workshop May 17 - 18

A few GVWC members attended the Rochester Woodworkers Society lecture and workshop featuring Emilie Rigby. Emilie is a green wood carver making spoons and other objects starting with the tree. It was interesting to see her process and the tools she uses to turn a hunk of tree into blanks for spoons. She also demonstrated Kolrosing. Kolrosing is a traditional Swedish, Norwegian and Eastern European tradition of decoration. It involves cutting a pattern with a single cut and filling the line with a pigment. The pigment could be coal or soot or a ground pigment. Emilie used cinnamon. The designs could be used on carved spoons, bowls, etc. I could see carving a tattoo on a caricature arm with kolrosing. It is always good to expand your horizons and learn something outside of your traditional craft. 
