Important Updates

There have been changes to the Genesee Valley Woodcarvers club over the last few years. Most recent is the approval of our application to become a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit tax exempt organization. Consequently, an update to the club bylaws was in order.

The Proposed Bylaws change will be discussed and voted on at the October meeting.

Synopsis of Bylaws changes

Overall - General cleanup for consistent wording and removal of redundant wording.

IV Meetings - allowing general meetings during the summer by Board decision

V Dues – Removes dues amount from bylaws and allows changes at a regularly scheduled meeting by active members present at a scheduled meeting after the change in dues has been published in the newsletter

Allows special rate dues to be used as a promotion during the Annual Show.

VI. Board of Directors – identifies elected and appointed members, also has the immediate predecessor President as a member.

VIII Split Secretary and Membership into two positions, each a Board Member

Al Jordan Class

This information is provided for you to start thinking about attending the class, save the dates, requirements, etc. Complete sign up and cost information will be announced in the future.

The club is thrilled to host World Championship Bird Carver Al Jordan for the second of two classes funded by the Arts in Education Grant from the Genesee Valley Council on the Arts Al is a gifted teacher and many of his students have gone on to win awards at the local and national level. He is willing to share all his "secrets" and techniques. A licensed falconer, Al's intimate knowledge of bird anatomy makes his classes lessons in both art and nature.

Price: Similar to that of the Rich Wetherbee class. Details forthcoming.

Al will teach the carving and painting of a male Blue Jay smoothie. This means there will be no detailed texturing or woodburning. The bird will be mounted on a stump created by the student. The class fee covers the blank, eyes, cast feet, and paint. To save time, Al will mix paint colors for the entire class. Students should be able to complete the project in the time provided.

This is power carving class. Each student should provide:

Foredam and bits

Micromotor and bits

Dust collector

Painting supplies (brushes, mixing plates, water jars, paper towels, etc.)

If you do not have power tools, don't let this be a barrier. We will try to arrange loaners.

Proposed schedule - flexible of course

- **Day 1.** Discussion of bird anatomy, major feather groups, and the art of creating a complete bird sculpture. Begin shaping bird.
- **Day 2.** Continue shaping body and head. Define feather groups. Discuss mounting of bird on stump.
- **Day 3.** Paint, finish stump, mount bird.

This is an amazing opportunity. Let's fill all 8 spots.

This project is made possible with funds from the Statewide Community regrant, a regrant program of the New York State Council on the Arts with the support of the office of the governor and the New York State Legislature and administered by the Genesee Valley Council on the Arts.
