Important Updates

There have been changes to the Genesee Valley Woodcarvers club over the last few years. Most recent is the approval of our application to become a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit tax exempt organization. Consequently, an update to the club bylaws was in order.

A copy of the proposed update is included in this September newsletter. The updated Bylaws will be presented and discussed at the September meeting. A motion to vote for approval will be made and a vote taken.

We will vote on the **Bylaws dues only change** at the September meeting. The Proposed Bylaws change will be discussed and voted on at the October meeting. That way you can read the bylaws and ask questions before we vote.

Yes, it is confusing. Huge thanks to Bill Keller for slogging through all the Bylaw stuff!

Synopsis of Bylaws changes

Changes on proposed bylaws

Overall - General cleanup for consistent wording and removal of redundant wording.

IV Meetings - allowing general meetings during the summer by Board decision

V Dues – Removes dues amount from bylaws and allows changes at a regularly scheduled meeting by active members present at a scheduled meeting after the change in dues has been published in the newsletter

Allows special rate dues to be used as a promotion during the Annual Show.

VI. Board of Directors – identifies elected and appointed members, also has the immediate predecessor President as a member.

VIII Split Secretary and Membership into two positions, each a Board Member

Membership Renewal Time

There was discussion regarding the budget during the June meeting. The consensus of the members present was that we eliminate the actual cost of dues from the Bylaws. This negates the need to modify the Bylaws each time it is decided to change the dues. The change in dues would be discussed by the membership, published in the newsletter and then voted upon by the membership present at a regularly scheduled meeting. A provision was also added to allow a special rate to be offered during our yearly show.

It was agreed upon at the June meeting that the dues should be increased. The amount was a \$10 increase; making an individual dues \$30 and family dues \$35 per year.

Since we were in agreement at that time, we will vote on accepting the Bylaws' changes at the September meeting and then a motion will be made to increase the dues effective immediately.

Attached to the newsletter email is the membership renewal form. You can bring your form and money to the September meeting.

If you joined at show in April of 2024, your dues are good through August 31,2025.

Wetherbee Class

Happy 50th Anniversary Genesee Valley Woodcarvers! Our year-long celebration started in August, with a 2-day caricature carving class led by Rich Wetherbee, internationally recognized caricature carver. This event was attended by eight members - more information and pictures from the class are included in this newsletter. In February 2025, six GVWC members will have an opportunity to attend a bird carving class led by internationally recognized bird carver (and GVWC member) Al Jordan. Both master-level classes are underwritten by a \$5,000 Arts-in-Education grant awarded to us by Genesee Valley Council on the Arts (GVCA). Funding for arts programming is highly competitive; our club was one of twelve organizations in Monroe County that divided \$60,000. Moreover, we received feedback that ours was one of the strongest applications submitted. It was co-written by Carla Watkins and Gayle Schneider; they were encouraged to apply again next year and well into the future. Please talk with them if you have ideas or connections to other professional carvers.

Rich Wetherbee taught caricature carving by demonstration and 1:1 interaction. He quickly assessed each participant's skill level and adjusted his comments and carving accordingly. Participants reported increases in their skills and knowledge of tool work, carving in-the-round, 3-D composition, and rendering facial expressions. Rich provided a large selection of roughouts as well as a finished caricature carving for each roughout so that students had the benefit of examining the finished model as they carved. Each caricature told a story through facial expression, body posture and selected props. For example, "Back Forty", carved by Rick Reber, depicts a friendly gas station attendant leaning on an old-timey pump; "The Regulator", carved by Steve Piecuch, tells the story of a new sheriff in an old western town; and "The Gargoyle", carved by Rob Lucci, depicts the fantastical creature sitting on his perch. Club members were pleased with their progress and gave this class high marks!

We will be carving a Redheaded Woodpecker and a "log" base. The class is a Community Education class at West Irondequoit High School begins on September 24 and ends on November 12, 2024.
